

Unit 4 My Scariest Experience

<p>★Brainstorming (pages 32-33)</p>	
<p>Learn the Words</p> <p>Have the students look at the words and the pictures. Ask the students to read the words before they choose the answer to each question. Then, read each word to the students and ask them to repeat the words out loud.</p> <p>Warm-up</p> <p>1. Have the students look at the pictures. Point to each picture and talk about it.</p> <p>T: Look at the pictures. The boy and the girl are ready to ride their bicycles. They are wearing helmets. Good for them. There is a cliff in the next picture. You should be very careful when you climb a mountain cliff. Never go near the edge. An edge is the outside limit of an object, area, or surface or the place or part farthest from the center of something. Can you see the red arrow in the picture? The arrow is pointing to the edge of the cliff. Let's move on to the next page. There is a shark coming. Stay away from it. A girl has fallen down on the floor. Is she hurt? A flashlight is very useful when you are in a dark place. The girl is yelling. Is she yelling a warning, or is she asking for help? There appears to be a family reunion in the last picture. Everyone looks very happy. Now, share your own scary experiences in class.</p> <p>2. Ask them the questions.</p> <p>3. Ask them the answers.</p> <p>T: What were you doing during your scary experience? What did your mother/father tell you not to do? What happened to you? What did you say that you should do? 1. Have the students turn to page 36.
2. Tell the students to look at the grammar charts. Then, explain each grammar point on pages 36 and 37 by using the example sentences.

T: Now, look at the first grammar point in this unit. You'll learn about direct and indirect speech. You can use direct speech to repeat the exact words a person says. And use indirect speech to report the words a person says. Use quotation marks with direct speech. Use the word *that* with indirect speech. For example, direct speech is "I said, 'This is very scary,'" and indirect speech is, "I said that this was very scary." When changing direct speech to indirect speech, you may need to change the pronouns. Make sure the verb in the sentence and the verb in the indirect speech are the same tense. Now, let's practice what we learned. Change the sentences with direct speech into ones with indirect speech and the sentences with indirect speech into ones with direct speech.

T: Let's move on to next grammar point, which is about interjections. Interjections are words that show feelings. You usually use them
